Conference participants have published great many scholarly articles over the 15 years of the conferences – apart from 8 collections of papers published in the series of *Papers on Language, Culture and Literature* by Krosno State College, a volume on *Migration, Narration, Communication* have been published in the international Peter Lang publisher as well as recently a special issue in the Estonian literary journal called *Methis- Studia Humaniora Estonica* (2018). You can read all about the conferences and publications on our website and look at them in our library across the square from here– I strongly recommend a visit there.





I believe this steady effort is bringing progress in scholarship and mutual understanding and this time it will do so too. I am glad that you have all accepted the invitation from Krosno State College and have come to our town – we are always happy to welcome visitors as some of you, our regular guests, may testify – this is not the first and hopefully not the last visit for you. We will continue to invite Polish and international scholars in the future since this is always an eye-opening experience both for us, academics and administrators, and for our students.
